Peace Corps Program Update

Peace Corps Dominican Republic resumed Volunteer service in March of 2022 and currently has 69 Volunteers serving in 13 provinces and 29 trainees, scheduled to be sworn in on November 1st. The next training group will arrive in March of 2024. The goal is to reach 160 Volunteers by next year. All volunteers are supporting primary and secondary schools, working in childhood literacy, youth, and community economic development.

A number of Peace Corps Volunteers are involved in organizing a digital literacy conference in collaboration with the Ministry of Commerce. The 10+ workshops will strengthen small businesses by inviting 43 business-owners and focusing on financial literacy and digital marketing. Learn more about the project here.

Fondo Quisqueya Success Story

Prior to 2015, Fondo Quisqueya partnered directly with Peace Corps Volunteers to identify educational scholarship recipients and serve as the logistical conduit. However, with a shift in Peace Corps' regulations as well as a desire to support more far reaching



change, we are also partnering directly with Dominican institutions.

For 8 years we have worked with the Instituto Técnico Superior Comunitario (ITSC). We have provided grants to 300 students totaling \$100,000. The grants primarily cover transportation costs. In addition to identifying candidate recipients and disbursing money, ITSC provides academic and socio-emotional support to FQ scholarship recipients. In a recent visit to ITSC this June, student services director, **Carlos**, pictured on the far right, knew the names, stories, coursework, and struggles of all the students we worked with. Great to see that strong on-the-ground support!



Partnership Update: FEM Dominicana

We're thrilled to bring you the latest update on a groundbreaking women's capacity building program, Fundación Empodera Mujer Dominicana (FEM Dominicana). With women's empowerment at the core of the mission, this initiative aims to unleash the untapped potential of women.

What's been happening?

Unveiling. FQ began providing support for FEM Dominicana in January 2023. The program was formed by local Dominican women seeking a way to give back to their community. The program is focused on serving women's empowerment, capacity building, and equal access.

Inspiring Success Stories. There's nothing more gratifying than witnessing the participants' incredible journeys. FEM Dominicana has seen <u>success stories</u> of women and launching their own businesses. These inspiring stories affirm the belief in the importance of nurturing women's talents and aspirations.

Strengthening Partnerships. Collaboration is the key to fostering change, which is why FEM Dominicana has established strategic partnerships with like-minded organizations and influential leaders. Recently, they worked with a men's training program to apply for a grant that would provide FEM Dominicana women the opportunity to learn to operate heavy equipment. Together, FEM Dominicana is creating a formidable network that inspires and supports women on their path to success.

What's in store for the future?

Volunteer Program. We recognize the critical role of mentorship in women's professional development. In June, FEM Dominicana held a volunteer recruitment and training workshop for new volunteers. Many of the volunteers are from local medical schools. The participants will now have access to more women to guide them on their journey, helping them navigate challenges and unlock their full potential.

Expansion. FEM Dominicana is exploring options for expanding to a second site to enable more women to materialize their dreams.




From the President
