# FQ ANNUAL MEETING

On Sunday, June 26, Tom and Sue Gittins hosted the Fondo Quisqueya annual meeting and picnic. Our special guest was Kristin Kaper, who is the new Country Director for Peace Corps DR. Kristin was previously the Programming and Training Officer (PTO) in Panama and the Chief of Training for Latin America and the Pacific.

# Fondo Q Rolls Out a New Website

The Fondo Quisqueya website, <u>www.fondoq.org</u>, was developed in early 2000 and, until October of this year, had never received an upgrade. It was really showing its age! Fortunately, FQ received an offer from CharityAdvantage, one of the largest providers of websites to nonprofits in the U.S., to participate in their Outreach 20/20 Program. This program, open to nonprofit organizations with an annual budget of less than \$1.5M, provides the same services, free of charge, as those provided to CharityAdvantage's paying users. FQ's only cost is for the website hosting (which is paid for by one of FQ's supporters); there are no other fees and the costs will not rise over time.

In FQ's case, since we already had a website, CharityAdvantage converted it to one of many available through CharityAdvantage's pre-designed formats and then integrated it with new tools and advanced features. And the best parts of the program for FQ's volunteers are the easy-to-use content management system and the unlimited technical support!

FQ's website won't be using all of the features offered by CharityAdvantage, but many have already been incorporated into the new and improved site. We invite you to visit the site and give us your feedback. What would make your visit to the site more enjoyable or productive? We look forward to hearing from you.

# INSTITUTO TÉCNICO SUPERIOR COMUNITARIO GRANTEES

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Many thanks to our traditional and some new donors this year, whose generosity has allowed FQ to keep pace with its grant-making at the three-quarters mark. Our direct support to beneficiaries at this juncture is at about US\$9,500, less than US\$100 short of FQ donations year-to-date. We will exceed our yearly direct support goal of US\$12,000 by year's end, and I feel certain that those who traditionally support us at the end of the year will give us that "income bump" that ensures we meet our revenue goals to cover a year's worth of program, communications, and administrative expenses.

We are always happy to share the news that a donation was made in memory of a loved one or to honor someone's birthday or to remember a PCDR group. So feel free to make such notes on your check or where indicated in an online donation. Those expressions are printed in the Honor Roll of Donors included in each newsletter.

Lastly, I was happy to recently receive an email communication from a donor who wanted to set up a monthly donation sent automatically from his account.
